

ECONOMIC AND FINANCIAL SUMMARY

In the financial year 2022, the Foundation's total income reached 49.9 million Euros, with an increase of 6.4% compared to the financial year 2021 With an efficiency- and social sustainability- oriented approach, Fondazione Cariparma manages its assets with the aim of preserving and increasing them over time: the profits from its assets allow the Foundation to perform its institutional activities, i.e. to allocate resources to social utility projects that drive the development of the local territory.






PERFORMANCE OF THE OPERATING SURPLUS OVER THE THREE-YEAR PERIOD 2020-2022

The fields of intervention of our Foundation belong to three macroareas: Personal Services, Art and the Environment, Scientific and Technological Research.

The Foundation also directs its action towards the SDGs model, a common line of action for the Foundations of banking origin.



The Foundation allocated the largest share of resources to the macroarea of Personal Services (53% of the total). This area includes several relevant sectors, such as Public Health; Preventive and Rehabilitative Medicine; Education, Schooling and Training; Volunteering, Philanthropy and Charity; as well as the eligible sectors of Care for the Elderly; Youth Growth and Education; and Family and Associated Values.For this macro-area, the Foundation intervened especially through one tool, Calls for Proposals, namely by launching five specific Calls for Proposals based on all four main axes identified in our 2021-2023 Strategic Plan: birth rate, inclusion, education, and health. The macro-area of Scientific and Technological Research consists of the relevant sector of the same name. The Foundation pursues this objective as it strongly believes that investing in research and development is key to the economic, social, cultural, and sustainable growth of a country.





The macro-area of Art and the Environment includes one relevant sector - Art, Activities and Cultural Heritage - and one eligible sector -Environmental Protection and Quality.

Compared to previous years, the Foundation significantly increased its grants in this macro-area, which exceeded 10 million Euros and accounted for 43% of the total of contributions approved for disbursement. Such increase was also due to the importance of the Environmental Protection and Quality domain, for which the Foundation launched a thematic call for proposals for the first time.



In 2022, in order to implement the guidelines of the 2021-2023 Strategic Plan, Fondazione Cariparma pursued its corporate purposes through the following intervention strategies, which were implemented both through Calls for Proposals and direct grants:

Own projects

Projects and/or initiatives designed, implemented and managed directly by the Foundation, also in cooperation with other organisations while keeping the leadership of the project.

Contributions to third parties

- *Support to projects:* Grants for specific projects/initiatives, with specific objectives.
- Support to corporate activities: Grants aimed at supporting the overall activity of an organisation.

Systemic actions

These are initiatives in which the Foundation sees an opportunity for a joint intervention with other foundations of banking origin with the aim of showing its commitment and support in response to needs that are considered a priority or that are particularly important in general. Most often, these actions include the response of the Foundations' system to situations of emergency or strategic/institutional relevance.










Support to initiatives that impacted on young generations
